ASSOCIATE CHAPLAIN (PSYCHIATRIC REHAB) FOR SAMH/SACS CHAPLAINCY MINISTRY

SAMH/SACS are the medical and community service arms of the Diocese of Singapore. The Chaplaincy Ministry is provided by the Diocese through Anchor Parishes appointed by the Bishop of Singapore to provide pastoral and spiritual care for the beneficiaries and staff of SAMH/SACS Centre.

The Associate Chaplain will be employed by the Anchor Parish - All Saints' Church - to provide holistic pastoral and spiritual care for about 156 residents, 50 day care members, 30 volunteers, and 35 staff members.

DUTIES & RESPONSIBILITIES

- Conduct regular pastoral rounds to look into the wellbeing of the residents, day care members, and staff
- Provide pastoral support/counselling in collaboration with counsellors to residents and day care members
- Provide supportive listening to counsellors and staff
- Conduct regular chapel services, devotions, bible studies, and prayer meetings as situation permits
- Recruit, train and support volunteer befrienders to provide more social and spiritual engagement for residents and day care members
- Work collaboratively with other departments to facilitate, enhance, and promote mutuality and reciprocity
- Raise awareness of the Centre's needs to All Saints' Church and other interested churches through prayer meetings, psychoeducation seminars, and other opportunities for sharing
- Write monthly reports to ACC Simei Head of Departments, and quarterly report to the Diocese

REQUIREMENTS

- Has a calling to serve persons with mental health needs with pastoral skills
- Has a theological degree at a recognized institution or is working towards one
- Fluent in English and Mandarin and preferably also in one dialect
- Competent in office productivity software Eg., Microsoft Office
- Open to learning new things and experiences and regularly be supervised by the Lead Chaplain
