The theological college was built for the purpose of training Anglican workers who will be sent out throughout all Indonesia, and it was consecrated to the Glory of God on the same day. Praise be to God!

Indeed, we give thanks that while the harvest is plentiful and labourers are few, our Lord continues to raise up workers in our midst so that we are able to fulfil the Great Commission by bringing the Gospel to the ends of the world.

In September 2023, with sadness, we bade farewell to Revd Gilbert Wong, who resigned from serving as the chaplain to our social service due to personal reasons. Also, we thank and appreciate Revd Michael Lim who retired on 22nd December 2023.

Holding Fast

We rejoice with St Andrew's Mission Hospital (SAMH) as they, in June 2023, celebrated the Centenary Homecoming of the first St Andrew's Mission Hospital building at Erskine Road. This occasion highlighted SAMH's legacy of care to our society and I am glad that they are growing from strength to strength in their services to the residents in Singapore.

SAMH has launched two new centres, St Andrew's Senior Care Bedok-North and St Andrew's Senior Care Bedok-South. They target to set up another 3 new services by the first half of 2024. Let us continue to uphold the work of SAMH in prayer, that they will continue to be a blessing to our society.

On 5th August 2023, Lat Krabang Anglican Church from the Deanery of Thailand celebrated her 10th anniversary of her first Sunday Service. We rejoice to see many faces there that would not have received the good news of Jesus if not for the planting of this church. This year, Lat Krabang Church will undergo the next phase of her church building project to include additional worship and ministry space, a kindergarten for 120 students and space to house headquarter operations for the deanery. We continue to pray for the staff and members in the Deanery of Thailand, that they will advance in mission with one heart and mind.

Back in Singapore, I am heartened to hear positive reports of developments and initiatives amongst our 7 Area Groups. The inaugural St Andrew's Village (SAV) Family Day on 7th October 2023 by Area Group 5, the Amazing Race on 29th June 2023 by Area Group 6, are just some examples of wonderful initiatives by the area groups that allow members and leaders from the various parishes to interact with one another. Area Group 7 also had the Vicars exchanging pulpits with one another to preach at the other parish.

At the May Synod last year, we heard about the launch of the Parish of the Week (POTW). Having been personally involved in some of the POTW activities, I am truly excited yet humbled to see the Lord's hand upon us through this campaign. I have received so many good comments from all across the Diocese, including our deaneries! Many expressed how they are moved when they see other parishes being featured, how they are reminded we are one Diocese, many parishes. The history of each parish featured encouraged many when they see how God has so faithfully brought the parish to where she is today. Others are moved by the Lord to reach out to the parish to help, whether it is finance, prayer or time.

As the Diocesan Central Administration (DCA) team labour on with the other parishes for Season 2 of POTW this year, let us continue

to pray and trust in our God to bring about His beautiful plan to unite the Diocese together as one – forging strong and stable relationships at various levels – between parishes, within the Area Group, within the parish, between parish leadership and clergy and so on.

Forging Ahead

Indeed, relationships, which incidentally was the focus of my 2023 May Synod Address, are the glue that holds the church together. And authentic and strong relationships are not built overnight – they need time to be developed, tested, refined.

For the Body to be united, we have to develop authentic relationships across all facets within the church. Just as a net, made up of countless strings, is strengthened when more and more strings are woven and knotted close together, so will we, as a Diocese, grow stronger as we build stronger and more authentic relationships around us. And with the Lord leading, we will grow stronger - within our parishes, area groups, Diocese, and the Province.

Certainly, we cannot talk about authentic relationships without talking about love, in particular, the type of love that is articulated in the New Commandment (Matthew 22:36-40).

Jesus Christ is the perfect example of one who builds authentic relationships. Through the special work of the Holy Spirit, Jesus built relationships centred on love. Certainly, we cannot talk about authentic relationships without talking about love, in particular, the type of love that is articulated in the New Commandment (Matthew 22:36-40). Jesus calls us to love God and to love our neighbour as ourselves, so what is expected of us all (both clergymen and lay) is not to provide lip-service, but to actually live out the love of God that we have received through our salvation in Jesus Christ. We need to walk the talk, we cannot bury the one talent in the ground (Matthew 25:18), because the love of God is the foundation of our relationships in church.

During the season of Advent, we remember that we are living between the first and second coming of Jesus Christ. All of us have a mission, a mission that is getting increasingly urgent – to fulfil The Great Commission, making disciples of all nations. As we work toward strengthening our relationships within the church, let us not neglect the people outside the church. People who have not heard about the gift that God has given through Christ, nor experience the hope and love freely given by our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ.

The Word of God encourages us to be generous and care for those in need, to remember that they are also loved by God. We show love to all around us, even when we may not have the same views or beliefs. And loving them does not mean we agree with their choices, especially if those choices are in direct conflict with God's Word.

In order to discern between right and wrong choices, we have to first know Jesus. By loving and knowing Him through His Word, we know His heart and that forms the compass to direct the choices we should make. In the same way when we disciple with the knowledge of God's Word, we can be guided by God's principles and truth. It is important to understand that knowing God and loving God, similarly, knowing the Word of God and the love of God, are inseparable, as much as law and grace are inseparable.

We show love to all around us, even when we may not have the same views or beliefs. And loving them does not mean we agree with their choices, especially if those choices are in direct conflict with God's Word.

As we obey the New Commandment and carry out the Great Commission, may it be done not with human strength but by the mysterious and powerful works of the Holy Spirit, so that the love and knowledge come forth from within us,

bearing the testimony of the greatness of God. Brothers and Sisters-in-Christ, we are living in tumultuous times, unprecedented with many unknowns. What happened in the Gaza Strip, without question, is indeed very painful and tragic, likewise the Russian-Ukraine war. We are reminded of what our Lord has said in Matthew 24:7-8 "For nation will rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom, and there will be famines and earthquakes in various places. All these are but the beginning of the birth pains".

By loving and knowing Him through His Word, we know His heart and that forms the compass to direct the choices we should make.

Trials and tribulations are signs of the end times and the 2nd coming of Christ. Trials and tribulations are also meant to test and teach us (James 1), that we may find out if we are easily disturbed and worried by the things of the world and forget the most important twin-teaching of Jesus, which is the core of our faith, and what it means to be a Christian and a believer.

May I encourage us to continue to keep one another in prayer so that all of us will be steadfast in loving God and will go beyond the walls of the church to where God has called us to serve.

**INSTALLATION
OF THE 7TH ARCHBISHOP
OF THE PROVINCE OF THE
ANGLICAN CHURCH IN
SOUTH EAST ASIA**

The 23rd of January 2024 was a momentous day for the Diocese of Singapore. Our Diocesan Bishop, the Most Reverend Dr Titus Chung, was installed as the 7th Archbishop of the Province of the Anglican Church in South East Asia. He succeeded the Most Reverend Datuk Melter Jiki Tais to take on the mantle



of leadership in the Province and is only the third Singaporean Bishop to do so. Archbishop Titus is now the Archbishop overseeing four dioceses: The Diocese of Singapore, The Diocese of West Malaysia, The Diocese of Kuching, and The Diocese of Sabah.

The Installation Service was held at 4pm at the newly restored Nave at St Andrew's Cathedral. It was attended by many important guests. These include Singapore's former President, Dr Tony Tan, Cabinet Ministers Mr K Shanmugan, Mr Desmond Lee, and Dr Tan See Leng, Minister of State Mr Desmond Tan, other political holders, global leaders from the Anglican Communion, leaders of other faith and denominations. The high point of the service was undoubtedly the passing of the Primatial Cross from Archbishop Melter to Archbishop Titus. This signified the passing on of the provincial leadership from one bishop to the next.

The sermon that Archbishop Titus preached was also significant and stimulating. It put his theological nous and pastoral heart on full display. Names more commonly found in academia such as Augustine of Hippo, Karl Barth, John Calvin, Jonathan Sacks, and Isaiah Berlin were somehow squeezed into a

twenty-minute sermon. Truth – even religious truth is not only good but necessary for dialogue in the public square. Religion(s) is sometime disbarred from public societal discussions for fear that it could incite violence and sectarianism. The recourse to violence and force, however, is a sign of religious insecurity and a lack of faith in the nature of truth. Truth, as Archbishop Titus asserted, does not need any help from human violence. Those who truly offer and seek truth will understand that there is a profound dignity in difference. Truth values the diversity of convictions as something to be respected and not repressed. If anything, the pursuit of truth can coalesce around the pursuit of the common good. Christian truth can be offered to society in a humble manner that seeks dialogue, partnership, or even critique. Or to put it simply, the Christian voice can be offered in the spirit of loving our neighbour and building up society. Such a paradigm is profoundly insightful in the multi-religious yet secular context of our Province.



The gravity of the Installation Service then gave way to a more celebratory tone at the Thanksgiving Dinner. This was held at 7.30pm at the Fairmont Hotel. The Dinner was graced by President Tharman Shanmugaratnam and Ms Jane Ittogi, Cabinet Minister Mr Masagos Zulkifli, Minister of State Mr



Alvin Tan, several Members of Parliament, as well as several esteemed community and political leaders in Singapore. There were close to 900 guests including Christian leaders across the world, representations from all 27 Anglican churches in Singapore, St Andrew's Mission Hospital (SAMH) and Singapore Anglican Community Services (SACS), the healthcare and community service arms of The Diocese of Singapore and the Anglican schools. Guests were treated to many wonderful performance items. These include a handbell presentation by St. Hilda's Secondary School, a Chinese orchestra performance by Anglican High School, a dance by My Saviour's Church, a combined Chinese Choir and a song by SAMH and SACS.



As guests took their leave for the night, many brought home gifts that bore Archbishop Titus' personal touch. For example, the door gift included two

coasters that were based on his paintings. However, one small gift stood out for me. It was a small white collar pin that depicted Jesus washing His disciples' feet. The pin also included a Bible verse from Mark 10:45 – “To serve and not to be served”. This is a phrase that Archbishop Titus has repeated on numerous occasions and can almost be said to be his maxim as Bishop. This point should not be missed nor understated. Perhaps Archbishop Titus was reminding us and himself that we must not lose sight of what is important amidst the ceremonies and celebrations of his installation. That is, to remember that the way of Jesus Christ was never the way of the crowds, comfort, or celebrity status. It was the way of the Cross. This cruciform service for the sake of others must guide the way our churches function and the way we live our lives. In our endeavour to serve others, we thus mirror Jesus Christ who came to serve and not to be served. In that way, Archbishop Titus has perhaps already begun his archbishopric ministry of teaching and guiding the flock!

Diocesan Day of Prayer and Fast 2023

Holding Fast, Forging Ahead. Those four words formed the theme of Diocesan Day of Prayer and Fast 2023, held on Saturday 4th November 2023 at the Cathedral New Sanctuary, St Andrew's Cathedral.

The theme was appropriate, given the current and imminent turmoil that had unravelled in the world through 2022 and 2023, and it was extremely heartening to see various members of the Diocese, representing all 7 Area Groups and from various congregations and language groups, gathered at the Cathedral New Sanctuary that day, all ready for a time of prayer, fasting and intercession for the Diocese and beyond.

This year's Day of Prayer and Fast was helmed by the parishes under Area Group 4 of the Diocese – St James' Church, St Paul's Church, Light of Christ Church Woodlands, St Peter's Church, and Yishun Christian Church (Anglican).

Rev'd Canon Chua Siang Guan, Vicar of St James' Church, opened the session and soon the worship team from Light of Christ Church Woodlands led everyone into active and insightful worship.

The lyrics of the worship songs served as a prelude to the rest of the day's proceedings as they encouraged believers to hold fast and be encouraged that God is still in control and on the throne, despite the apparent world turmoil.



In his homily, Rev'd Edwin Tan, Vicar of St Andrew's City Church, shared from James 1:2-4 and emphasised on how, instead of avoiding them, Christians are to count troubles and tribulations as "opportunities for great joy" and recognise that all our trials come





under the authority of a sovereign God who uses them to accomplish His purposes for us.

Rev. Tan expounded further on how our lives as believers should be governed by how we think instead of how we feel. Amid the current backdrop of turmoil and catastrophe, he encouraged and exhorted all who were present to build their 'spiritual' muscles through the analogy of exercise. Trials allow us to 'build' endurance which then lead to spiritual growth, and make us more Christ-like.

He cautioned Christians against seeking the 'spiritual elation' they experienced in their early walk with God, as this would not lead to transformed lives or growing in maturity. While they are important in affirming and encouraging a new believer of God's love, protection, and lifelong guidance, these 'spiritual elation' moments would eventually wane, and trials would arise in their place.

To conclude, Rev. Tan drew from 2 Corinthians 12:7 on apostle Paul's experiences with his 'thorn in the flesh', Rev. Tan shared how suffering helps build endurance and humility, and removes pride. Such experiences would help Christians grow more like Jesus, who also suffered terribly and therefore can understand and walk alongside us in our sufferings and tribulations.



After the homily, the participants went into their breakout groups (English, Chinese and Tamil) to pray for the needs of the Diocese and beyond.

During the prayer segment, we prayed for Bishop Titus and his family as he prepared to be installed as the Archbishop of the Province of the Anglican Church of South East Asia in January 2024, the needs of the Diocesan Deaneries, the work of the Anglican schools and preschools, as well as the ministry of the community outreaches in Singapore.

Summing up the day's proceedings, Archdeacon Daniel Wee shared his joy at seeing the commitment to praying for "planting and sowing and reaping" for God's Kingdom. He exhorted all present to think of how they could be available for the Diocese's work during the coming years and reminded that it was important to rely on God as He gave the increase.

Recalling how the Holy Spirit touched the young people during the Charismatic Renewal of the 1970s, Ven Wee prayed that in the coming years, we would see a repeat of that visitation of the Holy Spirit. He also interceded for the next generation, calling upon the Lord to raise up more young people in the Diocese to serve with passion in the years to come.

Rev. Aaron Cheng from Church of the True Light said he was uplifted by Ven Wee's prayer and that "It was so heartening to see everyone gathered in unity for this year's Diocesan Day of Prayer and Fast. And (the) prayer for the young people was so important."

Many of the attendees remained at the Sanctuary after the event ended to share their thoughts and experiences. My heart felt greatly warmed and I was encouraged by our worship and prayers for the Diocese and beyond. Whatever the future brings, may we continue in this spirit as we move into 2024.

Ordination Service 2023

12th November 2023, Sunday was a momentous day for the Diocese of Singapore. The Ordination Service of 2023, was held at the Cathedral New Sanctuary (CNS), St Andrew's Cathedral, where about three hundred members of the Diocese were present in-person and many more online witnessed as three men, Revd Tan Jin Kiat Calvin (St John's – St Margaret's Church), Revd Ng Lian Wen Moses (Chapel of the Holy Spirit), and Revd Wu Wenbin (Church of Christ our Peace, Deanery of Cambodia) were ordained to the priesthood.

As the rich tones of the church organ reverberated around the Sanctuary, voices rose in worship of God through hymns such as A Mighty Fortress Is Our God, and The Church's One Foundation. A captivating sermon was delivered by Revd Steven Seah, the Dean of Cambodia, to encourage the three ordinands as they prepare themselves for ordination.

The ordination of the three men to priesthood saw them being presented by the Archdeacon of Singapore to Bishop Titus, where they took their vows and made their prayers before God. The spectacle of all the Diocesan clergy joining the Bishop on the chancel and collectively laying their hands on their new fellow priests continued to be

one of the most moving moments in the service. The service concluded with Bishop Titus celebrating Holy Communion with the newly ordained priests as co-celebrants.

While still following time-honoured tradition, this year's ordination was unique as there was no deacons ordained. With effect from 2023, the preparation period for the Diaconate has been extended from one to two years. As a result, the current cohort of trainees in the Vocational Discernment & Ordination Training (VDOT) process, which began in 2023, will only be ordained as deacons in November 2024. Together with ordinands from both the Archdeaconry of Singapore and the Deaneries, we expect to see a larger cohort being ordained in 2024.

2024 will also see the return of Ordination services to Cathedral's Nave. The newly enhanced and renovated Nave will lend an added air of grandeur and solemnity to an already uplifting liturgical service.

Let us keep the newly ordained priests in prayer as they begin a new season of ministry with heavier responsibilities. May the Lord who has called them also equip them with all they need. Amen.

The Diocese of Singapore has 27 parishes under our umbrella, all with their unique identities and strengths.

Parish of the Week is a 2-year campaign (2023-2024) where 1 week is dedicated to showcase each of our 27 parishes, letting the whole Diocese know more about them and to be better informed to pray for them.

The campaign comprises of various segments including the Vicar sharing with other clergy

St Andrew's Community Chapel *is 20!*

St Andrew's Community Chapel (SACC) celebrated her 20th Anniversary in 2023.

SACC was birthed in 2000 from two church plants – Simei Christian Centre from St Andrew's Cathedral and All Saints' Church Pasir Ris Extension. In 2003, St Andrew's Community Chapel (SACC) attained her parish status.

Since her inception, the church leadership was intentional to combine ministries such as children and youth across the English and Mandarin congregations. This has resulted in members between the two congregations sharing close bonds.

Today, SACC has a total of 4 services across both congregations and they continue to reach out to the residents in Simei and Tampines. Last year, she established an outreach centre 'The Friend Space' in Tampines Mart to connect with residents in the surrounding neighbourhood.

May SACC continue to strive to fulfil her mission, 'To be a house of healing to the nations, reflecting the glory of God, full of grace and truth.'



Ordination and Consecration of Anglican Theological College Indonesia (ATCI)

In the early months of 2021, I was in Singapore as the international borders were closed. One day, while I was busy with work, God intervened and spoke to me: "Go and buy a hotel in Bali for your theological college." That begun our search for a hotel in Bali, in obedience to God's instruction. I called my staff in Jakarta, Revd Stevanus Mudjianto, and told him to pass the news that the Anglican Church was looking to purchase a hotel. Unknown to us, the COVID-19 pandemic has greatly affected many hotels in Bali as the tourism industry came to a halt. Many small hotels were suffering and some of these hotels were put up for sale.



We managed to secure a 40-room hotel near Balangan beach. The negotiated price was around SGD 900,000/-. Since this purchase was initiated by God, He supplied our needs through business entities, parishes in Singapore and individuals. We were able to raise enough funds for the purchase as well as the renovations for the hotel and the conversion to a theological institution.



Some have asked us why we chose Bali as the place to locate our theological college. Bali, a province made up of predominately Hindus, is relatively peaceful both religiously and politically. Currently, there are only 3 mainstream theological colleges in Bali, including ours.

Some have also asked us why Gereja Anglikan Indonesia (GAI) needs to build its own theological college. There are three needs that are addressed here:



(I) *The need to raise new workers:* Our long-term goal is to see Anglican churches planted in the 38 provincial capitals of Indonesia. GAI has planted churches in 14 Indonesian provinces, there is a need to raise more workers and leaders for the church planting work. After which, these provincial churches in turn plant Anglican churches in their regencies, cities, districts, and villages. The manpower needed is massive and a GAI-based theological college is necessary to accomplish the work ahead.



(II) *The need to fill gaps:* GAI is also seeing the first generation of Indonesian clergy and pastors retiring from ministry. There is an urgency to fill the gaps in pastoral and clerical leadership.



(III) *The need for liturgical formation and Anglican ethos:* The spiritual life of Anglicans is shaped by Anglican liturgy. Many of our pastors are recruited from outside the Anglican denomination. They are shaped by the seminaries that they attended, and as such, the Anglican ethos and discipline are not part of their DNA. We need our own theological college to shape our future pastors and clerical leaders.

The event was preceded by the Province of South East Asia Missions Services (PROSEAMS) Meeting led by Bishop John Yeo and Ordination Retreat led by



Canon Yee Ching Wah and Bishop Titus Chung. 26th November 2023 would mark a historical moment for GAI. The building for ATCI was consecrated by Bishop Titus Chung and on the same day, we witnessed the priesting of twelve GAI deacons. The speaker for the occasion was Archbishop Melter Tais. In attendance were PROSEAMS members, which included three Assistant Bishops representing the Dioceses of West Malaysia, Kuching, and Sabah; our Archdeacon, Chancellor and Registrar, together with several Singapore clergy and support team from DCA, and Canon John Cruikshank from ACNA.

Praise God for His goodness and provisions for GAI.



Anglican Church in Thailand

2023 has been a fresh beginning for many congregations of the Anglican Church in Thailand (ACT). In January, Revd Noppadon Hattayanont moved from Christ Church Bangkok to provide fresh leadership to St Andrew's Church Chiangmai. He is the first resident Priest of the congregation. Revd Dhanadhis Jirathamkul took over from Revd Noppadon as Priest for the Thai Congregation of Christ Church Bangkok. Under his leadership, the Outreach to the Soi Phipat community has been intensified, Children's Ministry was re-energised, and Youth Ministry re-organized with an emphasis on discipleship. A new discipleship program for the adults was also introduced.

Ds Anong Lekmueng took a step of sacrificial obedience to move from Christ Church Ban Chang (CCBC) to Mae Sot. She has been serving at CCBC since 2004 and grew the small congregation from 20 members to 70 regular worshippers and multiple ministries today. Ds Anong's pioneering gift would be put to good use at St Stephen's Church at Mae Sot, a growing border town with Myanmar. The existing congregation of St Stephen's Church, that has just moved to the new premise, worships in the Karen language. Ds Anong launched a Thai ministry for the younger generation who are more accustomed to the Thai language. She also provided interim leadership for the congregation and the outreach ministry while Saw Richard completes his theological training at Trinity Theological College.

ACT will be undertaking two development projects in 2024.

(1) Two new blocks are being added to Timothy House at Omkoi to increase the capacity of the boarding house from 9 to 28 people.

(2) Project Lat Krabang to add three more buildings – Building A for Lat Krabang Anglican Church with a new sanctuary, offices and ministry rooms for the growing congregation. Building B for the headquarters of the Anglican Church in Thailand with accommodation and training facilities. Building C for a kindergarten to reach out to the surrounding community.

Fundraising for Project Lat Krabang started and we thank God that by September 2023, 75% of the budget required was received through the generous giving of many parishes and church members, and that enabled us to begin construction in 2024.

While the infrastructure development is taking place, the outreach to university students at Lat Krabang through Cornerstone Student Centre (CSC) was also relaunched on 4th September 2023.

As we look forward to 2024, the ACT family from all over Thailand will be gathering for a Combined Church Camp on 4th to 6th May 2024. The theme of the Camp, "One ACT advancing the kingdom together" spurs us to devote ourselves to ministry work with hearts and hands, to nurture people and to prepare facilities as home for ministries.

Cornerstone Student Centre

Located in Lat Krabang district, Bangkok, Cornerstone Student Centre (CSC) was set up in 2011 by the Anglican Church in Thailand, to facilitate conversational English lessons for local students. The centre is run by foreign volunteers, and largely supported by Anglican Churches in Singapore. As they teach, volunteers are able to share the gospel through long term relationship building and sharing Jesus through their own personal lives. CSC is found in a gated community, RNP place, which has many different accommodations that houses students from the near-by university, King Mongkut's Institute of Technology Ladkrabang (KMITL). KMITL is one of the top universities in Thailand for engineering and has many bright aspiring young adults. The majority of Cornerstone's students come from engineering faculty, which is the nearest to CSC.

Since its opening in 2011, Cornerstone has housed over 1000 KMITL students and a handful have come to know Christ. Unfortunately, CSC had paused its operations due to the lack of volunteers during the COVID-19 pandemic. After a 4-year hiatus, Cornerstone reopened on the 4th September 2023. Since then, we have had over 70 students register and about half have become regulars. Cornerstone is a home away from home, a place the students are comfortable in. Coming early before lessons and having dinner with the volunteers after lessons are some common practices the students look forward to.

I currently volunteer at Cornerstone and will be here for a year. It's been amazing having so many students come into the centre and for them to experience a very different style of teaching from what they are used to. Here, the students are heard, valued, and loved, and my prayer is for each person who comes into Cornerstone to experience the Father's love for them through the volunteer's interaction and love for them. We've had so many conversations about faith and opportunities to share our faith with some students. One has even started coming to church with us! We pray that God will soften the hearts of His children, that they may be open to the gospel and Jesus' love for them, and experience the light of Christ.

Cornerstone is open on Christmas with events and activities and it is a perfect opportunity for outreach and to share why we celebrate Christmas. Our prayer is that God will bring students ready to receive the gospel, and for His Spirit to move powerfully. We are His hands and feet, and can love and serve those around us, but it is God who will touch and meet with His children. We would love if you could join us in praying for God to touch the lives of these students.


